Innovations:

 I was primarily responsible for expanding "Case of the Week" –a Residency Teaching Program for pediatrics residents and medical students. I personally created over 60 new cases, covering various common and sometimes

uncommon pediatric problems. A new case was made available every 2 weeks. There were enough cases to last for 3 years, so the residents would not see any repeated cases during their residency. The residents would turn in their responses. And the "winner" in each residency class would receive a pediatric textbook at the end of the year. In 2007, the cases were made available online to make access easier for residents on elective rotations.

- Pediatric Jeopardy Inpatient Teaching Experience, for pediatric residents and medical students. Classic Jeopardy game with pediatric and Medicine inspired questions and answers. Sessions played several times each week after morning work done when I attended the Ward Service.
- Maternal Newborn Clerkship I developed the combined clerkship with OB.
 The clerkship consisted of 3 weeks of obstetrics and 1 week of Well Baby
 Nursery. I created weekly schedules, lectures, final examinations, and the
 newborn section of the practical exam. .
