Education & Curricular Development

- Development and implementation of the “Scholars Council” Curriculum 8/2016 – present
 - In the setting of senior resident clinic didactic afternoon (monthly)
 - Compiled active projects list for each resident, providing feedback on projects (journal or conference venue, manuscript review), creation of an academic year publication book
 - Curricular development includes lectures on tools for scholarly activity, reviewing a manuscript for publication workshop, a letter to the editor workshop, and a research in residency panel discussion
 - The letter to the editor workshop resulted in acceptance of 5 (out of 5) letters to the editor accepted for publication
 - Results from 2016-2017 ACGME survey demonstrated an increase in the “satisfaction with opportunities for scholarly activity” by 15% from the prior years’ survey result
- Roadmap to Fellowship 2017
 - Creation of a handout that maps out critical tasks for residents to complete during residency to prepare for fellowships (timing of research projects, meeting with mentors, application information, etc)
- Creation and delivery of “Big Picture” Board Review Handouts 2014 – present
 - Designed print materials/handouts for board review subjects, delivered at end of the year board review sessions (annual) and didactic board review sessions (weekly)
 - Board Review pass rate for 2016 graduates 100%

 - Designed and implemented voluntary workshops to build resident research skills with topics such as how make a poster presentations, how to write a clinical vignette manuscript, how to write a research abstract
