Holistic Intervention for Brain Health and Recovery (HI-BHaR Clinic)

The BI-BHaR Clinic provides behavioral health interventions focused on biopsychological factors to support recovery and brain health for patients with neurological disorders and other medical conditions. The clinic employs a neuropsychology-informed educational approach to brief, time-limited therapeutic models aimed at improving cognitive, emotional, and health behavior that impact recovery and rehabilitation. Interdisciplinary collaboration and communication are central tenants of the HI-BHaR clinic and therapists are integrated within occupational therapy, physical therapy, and medical treatment teams.

- Provided patient-centered evidenced-based cognitive (Brain HQ, CogSMART, Econ-Exec, Econ-Mem) and psychological brain health treatments to patients with neurologic disorders and medical conditions.
- Conducted intake interviews and created treatment plans according to presented difficulties.
- Prepared integrated psychological reports for patients and caregivers with recommendations for care.

Cognitive Rehabilitation and Support Group Therapist: HABIT Program

The HABIT program is an intensive multicomponent model of intervention for amnesic MCI. Trainees provide memory compensation training, supportive group therapy for patients and caregivers, wellness education, and computerized cognitive training.

- Intensive two-week cognitive rehabilitation program for older adults with mild cognitive impairment and their caregivers as part of the Physical Exercise and Cognitive Engagement Outcomes for Mild Neurocognitive Disorders (PEACEOFMND) program.
