NUSC 585: Advanced Research Seminar: To Boldly Go: Doing Research with Diverse Populations- Spring 2005
This course will focus on conducting intervention research with diverse groups that are traditionally underserved, including people grouped by gender, sexual orientation and ethnicity, children, and the elderly. Students will critically review strategies to recruit and retain diverse populations as well as develop research interventions, with an emphasis on cultural competency and health literacy. 3 credit hours

NUSC 595: Advanced Nursing Seminar: Conducting Integrative Literature Reviews - Fall 2006

This course aims to prepare the student to conduct reviews of the literature in selected areas of interest, critique multiple research/scholarly manuscripts with the purpose of examination of knowledge development relevant to the student's area of research interest, and write an integrative review for publication that analyzes specific areas of research/scholarship, explains the current state of knowledge, identifies current gaps in knowledge, and justifies proposed directions for future research. 1 credit hour.

NUSC 595: Advanced Nursing Practicum: Literature Synthesis – Spring 2007

This course will prepare students to conduct reviews of the research literature in selected areas of interest for a synthesis. Students will critique multiple research/scholarly manuscripts with the purposes of: examining knowledge development, analyzing specific areas of research/scholarship, explaining the current state of knowledge, identifying current gaps in knowledge, and justifying proposed directions for future research. This is a writing-intensive course with multiple assignments. One of the goals of the course is to help students fine-tune their writing skills. 3 credit hours.

NUSC 556: Developing Literature Reviews – Fall 2008

This course prepares doctoral students to conduct a literature search for published research on selected topics, critique multiple research/scholarly manuscripts with the purpose of examination of knowledge development relevant to the student's area of research interest and analyze specific areas of research/scholarship, explain the current state of knowledge, to identify current gaps in knowledge, and justify proposed directions for future research. 3 credit hours.

<u>N7010-001:</u> Domains of Knowledge: Examine the history of scientific inquiry knowledge development in nursing, critique and synthesize research to explain the current state of knowledge, to identify current gaps in knowledge, and justify proposed directions for future research.

<u>N7010-002</u>: Domains of Knowledge: Oncology Emphasis: Web-based course for the newly funded (NCI) online PhD in Oncology Nursing. Examine the history of scientific inquiry knowledge development in nursing, critique and synthesize research to explain the current state of knowledge, to identify current gaps in knowledge, and justify proposed directions for future research, all with an emphasis on oncology research.

<u>N6000: Scholarly Inquiry</u>: Acquiring knowledge and developing skills to engage in scholarly inquiry. These include being able to identify research problems, synthesize published research and evaluate research for use in clinical practice.

<u>N4100-01:</u> Nursing Research (Quantitative): This course is designed to develop the basic ability of the student as an informed consumer and participant in the process of nursing research. Students will collect, analyze, display, and interpret data to solve clinical problems and improve practice. Development of a sense of inquiry through understanding and applying the logical steps of the research process are emphasized.

N7961: Research with Diverse Populations: Research in cancer prevention and control in diverse groups, including gender and ethnically diverse groups, children, and the elderly will be examined. Students will analyze issues related to historical exclusion of particular populations from research including women, racial minorities, children, and the elderly. Strategies to recruit and retain members of these groups will be identified and evaluated. Students will also critically review published literature in cancer control with special/diverse population groups, as well as the principles of participatory research, cultural competence and health literacy. Regulatory and ethical concerns and gender and minority inclusion criteria in relation to proposal development will be discussed.
